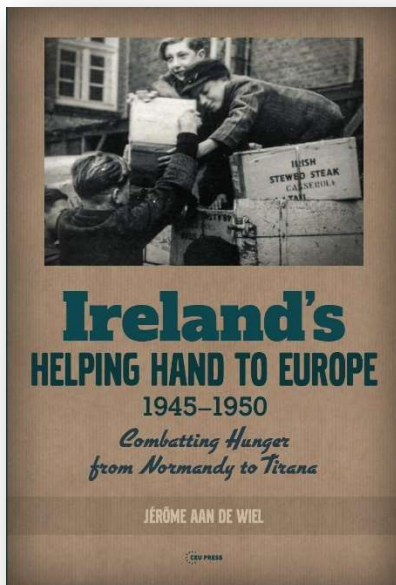

### Irish Humanitarian Aid to France after the Second World War, and French Child Refugees in Ireland after the Second World War

On 24 November, AMOPA Irlande will host a conversation with Dr. Jérôme aan de Wiel. Dr. de Wiel lectures in History and European Studies at University College Cork. His research focuses on twentieth-century European and Irish history, notably on the First World War, the Cold War period and post-war periods. His most recent book, *Ireland's Helping Hand to Europe 1945-1950: Combatting Hunger from Normandy to Tirana*, was published in October 2021 by the Central European University. His extensive, ground-breaking research in archives right across Europe over many decades has yielded rich studies of East German intelligence and Ireland (1949-90), German invasion and spy scares in Ireland (1890s-1914), Ireland's strategic and diplomatic importance for foreign powers, Ireland through European eyes (1945-73), French military intelligence and Ireland (1900-23) and the darker side of Franco-Irish relations.

Dr. de Wiel was born in the Netherlands. His mother was French and his father Dutch. He studied in the Sorbonne Nouvelle and Caen University. He is fluent in Dutch, French, English and German, and has a good reading knowledge of Italian.
